David Wheelock announced that USDA has 2004 orthophotography available for Oklahoma. The 2-meter photography is still in review but is available for purchase at \$50 per county.

Mary Banken discussed NSGIC's desire to have imagery for the nation. There is a proposal being put forward that the federal government should fund a national orthophotography program that works for state and local governments. Mary is attending the upcoming conference and can take any comments to the committee.

Mary Banken mentioned that a company, Intermap Technologies, has created a 1-meter digital surface and terrain model, which they are reselling. 2/3 of the state is currently available. Contact Intermap Technologies for more information.

Mary Banken announced that Geo Information System has obtained a grant to start a centerline project in Oklahoma. The pilot project will be centered on Cleveland and Oklahoma County and should be finished within a year.
